# Helping Hedgehogs

What Should I Feed Hedgehogs?

Hedgehogs will also relish any combination of meat-based wet dog or cat foods as these are high in the protein that they need. Hedgehogs are lactose intolerant so please do not give them milk. Bread is low in energy so worthless to them.

To avoid the food you put out being eaten by pets or foxes you could make a feeding station that is difficult for anything larger than a hedgehog to access.



## Recipe



## Cute Hedgehog Cookies

#### **Ingredients**

- 250g butter, softened
- 140g caster sugar
- 1 egg yolk
- 2tsp vanilla extract
- 300g plain flour
- Nutella
- Chopped pecans/sprinkles



#### Method

- 1. Mix the butter and caster sugar in a large bowl with a wooden spoon, then add the egg yolk and vanilla extract and beat to combine.
- 2. Sift over flour and stir until the mixture is well combined you might need to get your hands in at the end to give everything a really good mix and press the dough together.
- 3. Roll out and shape into teardrops
- 4. Bake at 180 degrees for 12 minutes.
- 5. Place on a cooling rack and wait until cool.
- 6. Spread Nutella on the back of each hedgehog and sprinkle over the nuts/sprinkles. ENJOY!

## Origami Butterfly





- 1. Fold a square of paper in half diagonally to make a triangle.
- 2. Working from center line out make zig zag folds about 1cm (0.5") apart, one half then the other



3. Put to one side.



4. Repeat with second piece of paper




5. Pinch together at center.



6. Wrap firmly with pipe cleaner and twist to secure, bend pipe cleaner to resemble antennae.



7. Open up wings and flatten edges to hold wing shape open.
