
StarLine Communications Toolkit

OVERVIEW OF STARLINE

What is StarLine?

StarLine is a national home learning helpline that gives parents and carers direct access to a team of qualified teachers, and education and parenting experts who can provide free one-to-one advice, support and reassurance.

StarLine is a sector-led initiative, which has been set up to help young people to continue to learn and stay safe until schools fully re-open.

How will StarLine help parents and carers?

- By providing access to a team of qualified teachers, education and parenting experts.
- By focussing on providing practical ideas, support and reassurance.
- By offering tips, techniques and resources to enable parents to give their children the support they need to continue learning while schools are closed.
- By supporting family wellbeing and mental health.
- By covering all phases of education and subjects plus behaviour, pupil wellbeing and SEND.

Who is involved in StarLine?

A group of partners, including the Department for Education, Confederation of School Trusts, David Ross Education Trust, Freshworks, Future Academies, Inspiration Trust, Mumsnet, Oak National Academy, PLMR, Star Academies, Triple P Positive Parenting Program and United Learning have come together to create and deliver StarLine. StarLine, which is backed by the Department for Education, leading academy trusts and parenting experts, has been established to support parents and carers with their children's home learning whilst schools are closed.

The helpline provides tips, techniques and resources for home learning, as well as support on wellbeing, behaviour and special educational needs and disability. Parents and carers will be able to talk to experts in English, including reading and phonics, mathematics, science, history, geography, modern foreign languages and PE, as well as Early Years specialists and primary school teachers.

StarLine aims to:

- Provide ideas for home-based learning that parents might not have considered and are practical and easy to deliver.
- Save parents time there's an increasing amount of information out there, but not all of it is helpful.
- Help parents to find answers to specific curriculum-related questions and navigate to quality resources.
- Make parents feel reassured and good about their role in home-based learning.
