

# Return to School in September 2020

## ***Does my child have to attend school in September?***

Yes, from Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> September all children **must** return to school.

## ***How will you keep my child safe?***

We will be putting measures with some details below to keep our community as safe as possible. We cannot guarantee that your child won't become unwell at any time.

## ***What will my child wear?***

Full school uniform must be worn each day. Children must bring a coat, drink and a packed lunch if required.. Bags or other items **must not** be brought between school and home.

## ***Can I call into the school office to drop something off or meet my child's teacher?***

No, the site is closed except for essential contractors and maintenance that are pre-arranged. Please call or email us.

### You will need:

A coat/ sun hat if hot weather

All children will need plenty of water in a labelled bottle.

If you do not pre-order a school meal, you will need to bring a packed lunch and bring your own spoon if needed.

### Other information:

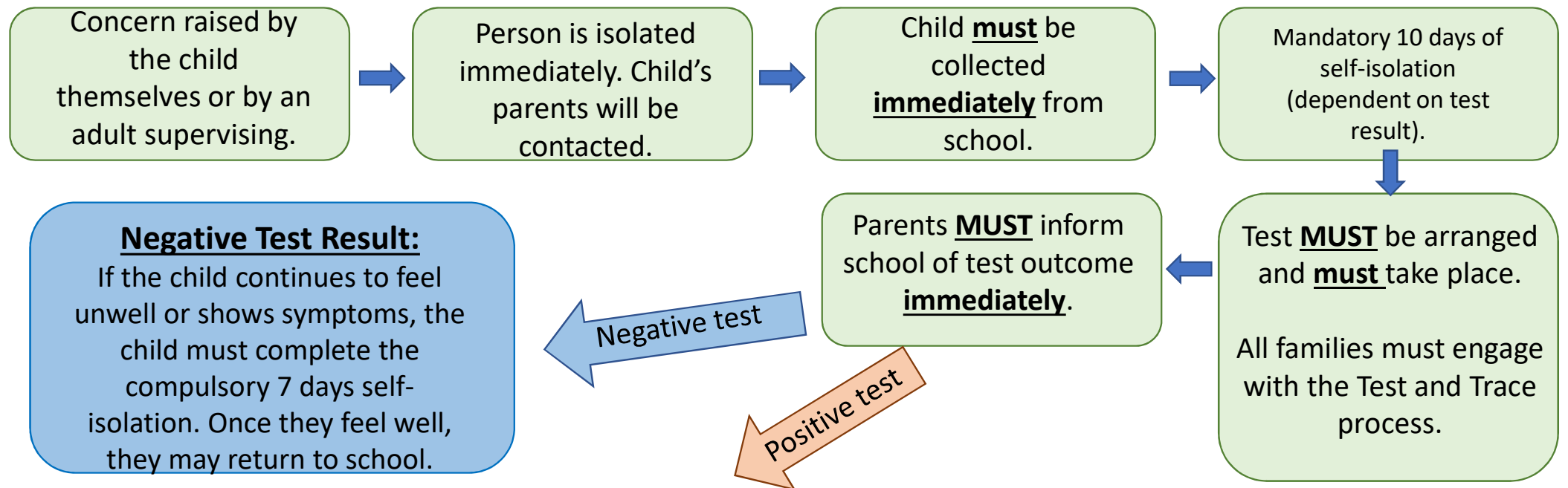
The car park will be **closed**. Parents, carers and taxis should not enter any part of the site **at any time**.

Start and end times will be **staggered**.  
Surnames between:  
**A – G** – 8:45am/3:15pm  
**H – O** – 8:55am/3:25pm  
**P – Z** – 9am/3:30pm

**All children must arrive and be collected at the correct time from the their classroom doors- a one way system will be in operation**

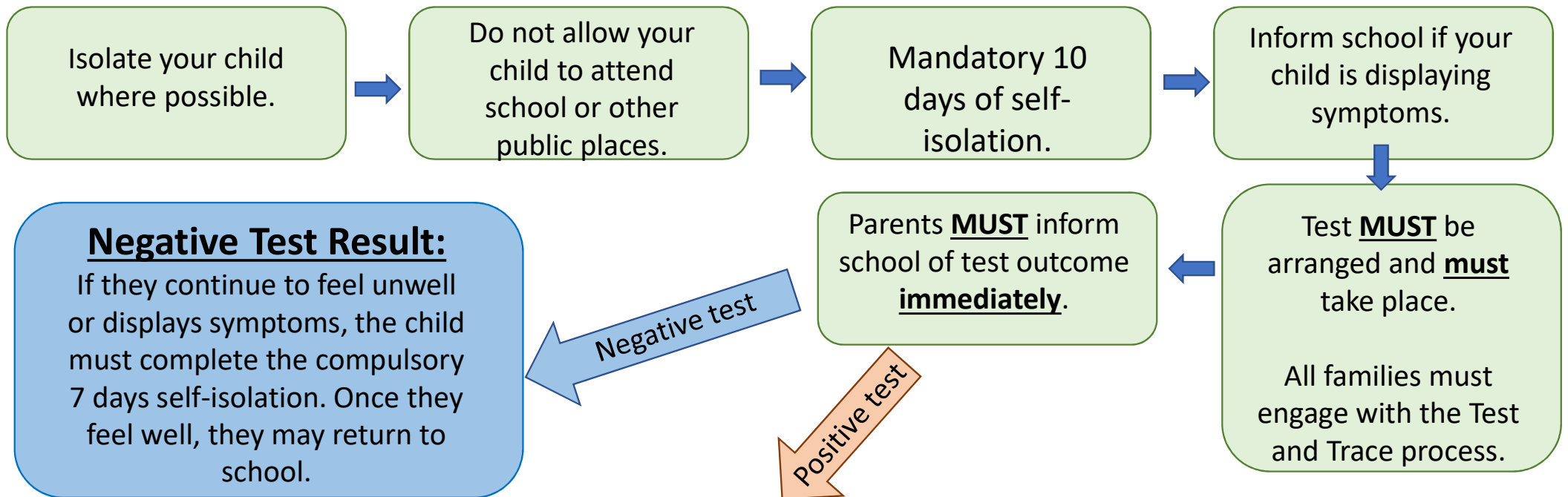
Each class will form its own bubble. As far as possible, these bubbles will not mix.

# School response if a child displays symptoms during term time.



**Positive Test Result:** The child must complete the compulsory 10 days self-isolation from the onset of symptoms. Further isolation under Track and Trace will be decided after advise from our local Health Protection Team after a rapid risk assessment is carried out. This will conform who has been in close contact with the person during the period the person with a positive result was infectious. Those people will then be asked to self-isolate. # What if my child displays symptoms at home?

# What if I am contacted by NHS Test and Trace?

If you are contacted on a weekend, inform school **by 9am** on the Monday morning.

**Will my child need their PE kit?**

You will be informed by your child's class teacher what day they have PE. On these days we ask that the children come into school in their kit to avoid unnecessary changing.

**Will my child need their book bag?**

No, items must **not** be brought between home and school – any books sent home will be placed in a sealed plastic bag.

**Will my child need a pencil case and other resources?**

No. Each child will be given their own personal pack containing all the equipment they need,

**My child has medication. How do I arrange for this to be taken in school time?**

If medication is required during the day, please call ahead to the office on 01829 270736 to arrange this with Mrs Hughes.

**Will my child be in a class with their peers?**

Yes, we currently plan that year groups will be taught together in their classrooms. Siblings will be taught within their own year groups.

**Will children social distance in school?**

Children within the same bubble will be in their class groups. Guidance states that children within the bubble may not be able to distance socially. Adults will distance from children as much as possible. During playtimes, the children will play in designated zones. Between these will be two meters 'Friendship Rivers' to allow children to chat across classes if they wish.

All playtimes will be staggered so that only one milestone (2-3 class bubbles) will be out at one time.

### **What will lunchtime look like?**

Nursery will eat in their classroom

Reception will eat in the Studio Hall on forward facing tables – no child will face another.

Milestone 1 (years 1 and 2) will eat in the hall if they are a school dinner and in classrooms if they are packed lunch.

Juniors will all eat in their class bubbles. School lunches will be delivered to their class doors and will be served by the class teacher. For the first 2 weeks, school lunches will be a mix of hot or cold packed lunches.

### **How do I drop off and collect my child/children?**

We are implementing a staggered drop off and pick up as of the first day of term. This will allow for fewer people entering the site at any one time. We are allocating time slots according to family surnames so that siblings can be dropped and collected all at the same time. We ask that families adhere strictly to the time slots allocated to avoid high numbers of people being on site at any one time and follow the one way system around the building to exit.

### **Will my child be able to access wrap around care?**

FACE and Breakfast Club will not operate for the first three days of term in order for the school to settle into the new systems .

It will commence on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> September

Emergency bookings will not be possible as we aim to be consistent with the groupings to allow for effective Track and Trace procedures.

Full details will be given to parents by Mrs Roderick within the first week of term.

### **Will there be after school clubs?**

Premier will be running some after school clubs but these will be limited to those that can be held outdoors. If it rains, the clubs will be cancelled as there will be no facility to hold them indoors.
