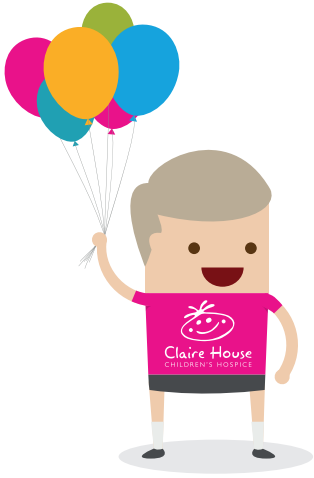


# Support Claire House by giving up your time for your tables this month!



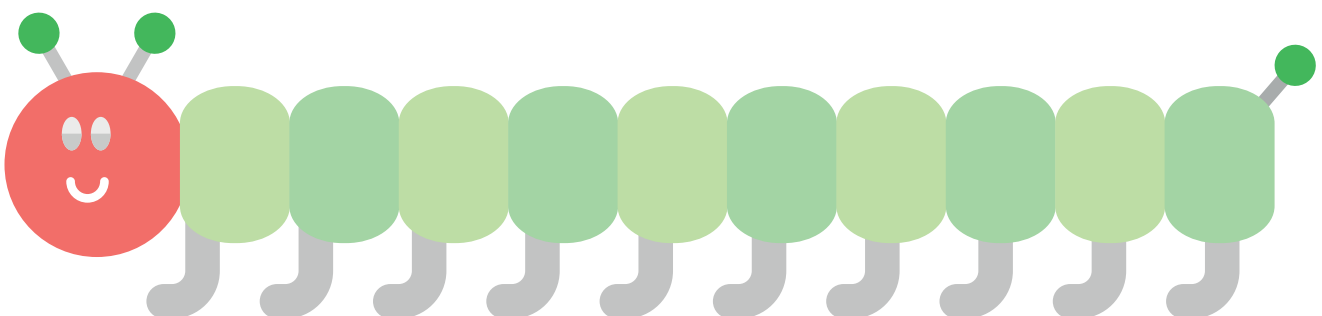
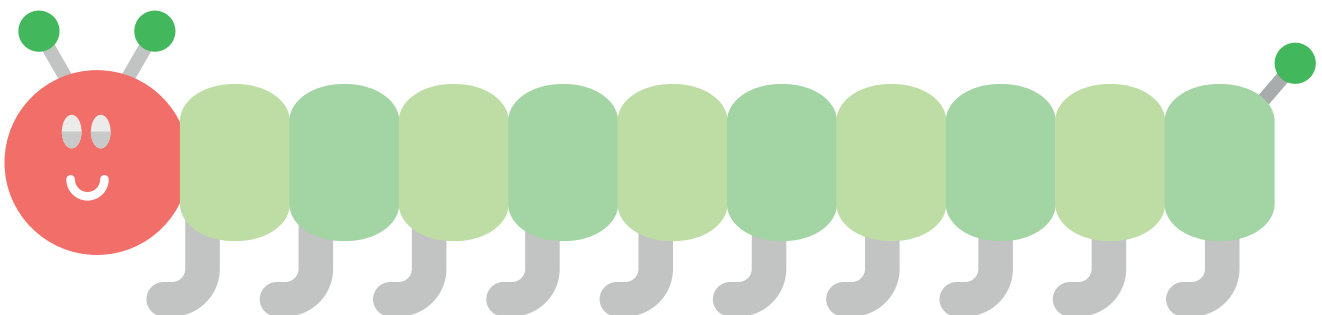
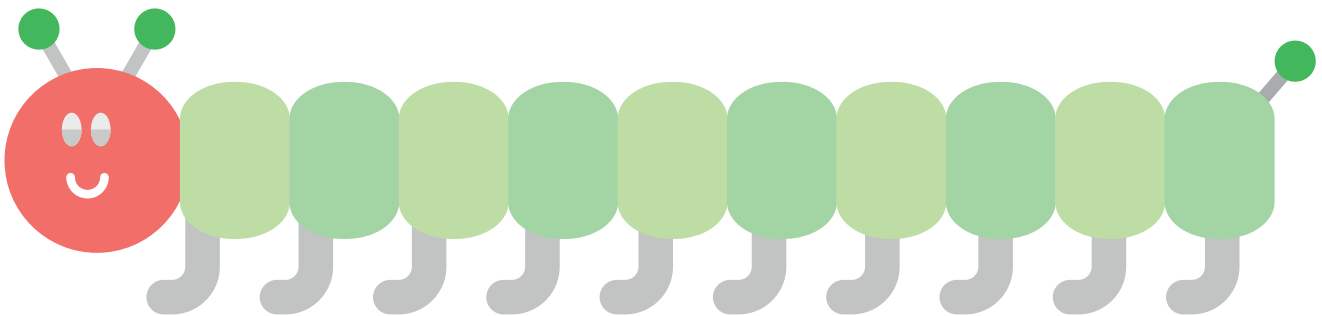
